We do not receive any state, federal, or local tax support. We do not duplicate services available elsewhere in the community.

### Market Research. Casa ALBA uses

Market Research surveys to better understand our client's needs and our performance. One source of feedback is the Net Promoter Score (NPS). Our clients give us an +89 NPS score, on a +100 (best) to -100 (worst) scale. The Upper Quartile cut-off is a +71.6 NPS score. The average NPS score is +32.

#### Our Volunteers.

Casa ALBA Melanie is on-pace for 75 volunteers to donate **3,700 hours of labor**, valued at \$172,500, in 2019. We are grateful to all volunteers that support our Latino neighbors.

## Phone Support.

Casa ALBA Melanie is on-pace to support **7,250 phone calls** in 2019. We provide our clients with translation services, referrals and general information.

We served 3,182 People in 2018. Plus, we welcome over 300 visitors per month.





#### 2019 PROGRAM & SERVICE OFFERING DEVELOPMENTS

6 Mobile Consulate Events. The number of Mobile Consulate events held in Green Bay will be doubled in 2019, from three to six dates! In our first two event dates, 266 people and their families were provided with critical documents. This compares to 367 people served in all of 2018. In addition, the Mexican Consulate has requested our support to help publicize other Mobile Consulate events in the region, to our clients.

### Strategic Philanthropy Award.

The University of Wisconsin-Green Bay's Strategic Philanthropy Class announced that Casa ALBA Melanie would be the recipient of a \$10,000 grant. The funds for this award were granted by The Learning by Giving Foundation, founded by Doris Buffett. Funds will be used to increase health screening outreach to families in partnership with the Brown County Health Department, and expansion of its early childhood program, Escuelita, which serves three- and four-year-olds and their parents.

### Diabetes Education.

Casa ALBA has begun to offer a diabetes education program in conjunction with the Brown County Health Dept. Spanish speaking area residents may not have had the opportunity to learn how to manage the disease. Eight-week classes offered at 9 AM on Sunday mornings provide essential information to these clients.

#### Píano Lessons.

Pablo Vazquez has volunteered his time on Saturday mornings to teach piano lessons to Hispanic youth. The one-hour sessions are the first opportunity for many young Hispanics to learn to play musical instruments.

### Computer Lab. casa

ALBA received a gift of five gently used computers from NWTC. The computers have been used to create a Computer Lab for our clients at our office. Three NWTC students volunteered their labor to create the Computer Lab.

**Brunch with Friends:** Casa ALBA Melanie's third annual "Brunch with Friends" event will be held on our grounds at 314 S. Madison Street, Green Bay. The event will be held from 10 AM to 4 PM on Sunday June 23. We will offer food, beverages, face-painting, games and raffles.
