## Casa ALBA director earns high honor

Crooks, a former Green Bay attorney, was elected to the Wisconsin Supreme Court in 1991. He served as chief justice from 2003 to 2015.

Crooks had been battling cancer for several years. He is survived by his wife, Mary, and two children.
