#### **BUILDING RENOVATION**

Casa ALBA Melanie purchased our office facility at 314 S. Madison Street in Green Bay in 2011. Since that time, through the generosity of our donors, we have been able to pay off our mortgage. But have also noticed several repairs that need to be made to the facility.

We have been working with a local architect, Chris Renier, who has volunteered his time to help us better understand the building's condition, its maintenance needs, create project specifications, bid the project and determine project costs. We have selected DeLeers Construction. to perform the work which can be categorized into five major project components: 1) Replace a deteriorating EIFS "Stucco" siding system, 2) Replace the worn vestibule area, 3) Replace our current single pane plus storm with energy-efficient windows and window treatments, 4) Add a kitchenette and an ADA-compliant bathroom, and 5) install more efficient lighting system in the building.

### **PERSON-OF-THE-YEAR**

The Green Bay Press-Gazette honored Casa ALBA Melanie as one of its 2018 Persons of the Year. We are humbled by their recognition of our work with Spanish GED classes, immigration attorneys, and Spanish language classes; as well as our work to bridge cultural divides with local police departments and school systems. It also cited our work in response to immigration raids and voter registration.

#### **THANKS VOLUNTEERS**

Year-end 2018 volunteer tracking showed 93 Casa Alba Melanie volunteers donated 4,473.3 hours at a value of \$192,641.48. In addition, 6 volunteers donated 634.5 hours valued at \$10,330.23, but are not included in the organization's Income Statement, due to GAAP accounting rules. Thank you to all our volunteers!

#### **FACEBOOK LIKES**

The Hispanic community often uses Facebook to communicate. Casa ALBA Melanie has stepped up to encourage greater use of this social media. We now have 1,643 Facebook likes, up from 404 in 2016, 593 in 2017 and 1,093 in 2018.

## **MOBILE CONSULATE**

In 2018, three Mobile Consulate events served 367 local families. The number of dates will increase from three dates in 2018 to six dates in 2019. The planned 2019 Mobil Consulate event dates are: May 11-12, August 24-25 and October 26-27. For 2019, the Mexican Consulate also expects to offer dual citizenship documents for young people. Thank you to St. Willebrord's for helping host these events.

## **ENDOWMENT CREATED**

Casa ALBA Melanie has created an endowment with the Greater Green Bay Community Foundation. Any excess operating funds will be deposited into this professionally managed account to ensure continued financial viability of the organization.

#### **DIABETES EDUCATION**

Casa ALBA Melanie has teamed up with two nurses at the **Brown County Health** Department and several other health care professionals, to create a pilot program designed to provide local Hispanics with diabetes education. Hispanics who are diagnosed with diabetes (which occurs with higher frequency in this cultural group) have no place to learn about the disease or how to live a wholesome life in spite of it. Classes were held on Sunday mornings, from 9:00-10:30 AM at the ADRC (Aging & Disability **Resource Center**). Eight sessions were offered from Oct 7 to Dec. 16, 2018. Eleven adults

participated and attended faithfully throughout the program. Another young woman provided childcare for the families who needed to bring their children. Grant money was provided by Resurrection Parish's Large Impact grant and Green Bay Diocese's Rice Bowl grant. Grants were received from a health insurance specialist. Even the Green Bay Water Dept. provided free water bottles for the participants.

## BEST OF LUCK Give BIG Green Bay Organizations!

We wish area non-profit participants the best of luck in the 2019 Give BIG Green Bay campaign. Casa ALBA Melanie is ineligible to participate in this year's campaign since we currently have an ongoing capital campaign underway to fund the renovation of our office building.
