NEW BOARD MEMBER



MOBILE MEXICAN CONSULATE - GREEN BAY

The Mexican Consulate in Milwaukee announced that they plan to hold three Mobile Consulate events in the Green Bay area in 2017. The 2017 Mobile Consulate events will be hosted at St. Willebrord Parish, located at 209 S. Adams St. Green Bay, WI 54301, on: May 13, August 26 and October 21. The Mobile Consulate will provide 125 appointments at each event. Appointments will be available from 9 AM to 2 PM. The Mobile Consulate will be used to process passports and consular matriculas. Appointments may be made, 20 days prior to the event, in the MEXITEL system by calling 1-877-639-4835 or on the internet web page: www.mexitel.sre.gpb.mw

WEBSITE UPDATED

The Casa ALBA Melanie website. at www.casaalba.org, has been redesigned to improve the site's architecture, navigation, content, and graphics. With the click of a mouse the entire site can be translated to the reader's language of choice. The new site links more readily to social media, like Facebook; and to the organization's new customer service computer system. The site covers new Programs and Activities and follows the organization Brand Standards. All work on the website was completed by Casa ALBA volunteers, and had no cost to the organization.

POWER OF ATTORNEY LEGAL DOCUMENT

Many local Hispanic families are afraid, even terrified, that their families may be torn apart by being deported. To help alleviate the anxiety, local attorneys and judges have prepared a "Power of Attorney - Delegating Parental Authority" form. The document provides instructions to the court system one how a minor US Citizen should be cared for, should a family member be deported. In addition, we are encouraging all minor US citizens, with an undocumented parent, to apply for a US passport. Minor children will need a passport to be able to reunite with family members should they be deported. Casa ALBA Melanie now has over 35 volunteers trained in assisting Hispanic families through the paperwork.

COMPUTER SYSTEM HAS BEEN IMPLEMENTED

Through the generosity of a donor, we have implemented a new computer system. Our DataPropeller system, allows us to track all Programs and Activities in a single computer program. The system was deployed with 100% volunteer labor. It tracks People, Programs, Participation and Progress of all our clients. It also offers a Portal to enroll in our Activities. Better tracking and data will allow us to apply for grants to help fund our operations.

MEXICAN CONSULATE MILWAUKEE OFFICE

On June 15, 2016, the Mexican Consulate established a new office in Milwaukee. Prior to the opening of the Milwaukee consulate, the Chicago office served Mexican residents in Wisconsin, Illinois and Indiana, a population of more than 3 million. The consulate will serve 53 counties in Wisconsin as well as 12 counties from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

MyHUTERRA PROGRAM

With the MyHuterra Program, ALBA at no cost to themselves; and local businesses can reach new consumers they might not have reached. MyHuterra is a local firm with a goal to "Shop Local, Support Local". They help locally owned businesses and franchises. Donors simply download the "MyHuterra" app from Google Play or the Apple App Store. Follow simple registration and select your preferred charities. Then when you make purchases from participating stores, use the MyHuterra app to take a picture of your receipt, enter purchase amount, and your charity will be rewarded with a charitable contribution.
